Through the Pathway and Pipeline Grant program, CurePSP provides *seed funding* to investigators who have innovative ideas that need *proof of concept or pilot* studies in order to qualify for larger funding sources. CurePSP provides grants to scientists of up to \$100,000 for one- or two-year studies. CurePSP has identified scientific areas of particular interest.

- Autophagy/proteostasis
- Biological roles of GWAS hits
- Environmental causes and geographical clusters
- Innate and adaptive immunity in tauopathies
- Mendelian families
- Mitochondrial Dysfunction
- Nuclear architecture, epigenetics and transcription regulation
- Sleep physiology
- System neuroscience (e.g., synaptic dysfunction or loss)
- Tau strains
- Validation of existing animal and human-derived preclinical models

Pipeline Grants:

- Biomarker validation (diagnostic, disease progression, comorbidities)
- Cell replacement therapy/regenerative approaches
- Diagnostic platform validation (e.g., RT-QuIC)
- Prodromal and early-stage diagnostic markers
- Proof-of-concept clinical trials
- Rehabilitation strategies for motor and nonmotor deficits
- RNA-based neuroprotection
- Symptomatic clinical drug trials
- Symptomatic clinical non-pharmacological trials
- Validation of novel drug targets
